A Word from our Health Specialists

Please remember that it is imperative we know about appointments for Residents so that we can prepare their medication lists and communications to their doctor. It's very important that we also receive the paperwork back when they re-enter the building. Not doing so can interfere with resident care and cause a delay in medication management.

We always see an uptick in medications being brought into the community this time of year. If someone asks you to bring them any medicated products including cough medicine, cough drops, or medicated lotions, please speak with one of the MPC Nurses - Dorothy or Suzette - before doing so. We need to have a doctors orders for ALL these items as they can interfere with medical care.

Kitchen Corner

Popcorn Balls

Our residents had so much fun making popcorn balls this year! They're easy to make, soft to eat, and a treat for everyone—anything with marshmallows is always a hit!



Ingredients:

- 1 Tablespoon Vegetable oil
- ½ C popcorn Kernels
- 6 T butter
- 5 C miniature marshmallows

Grease a 9x13 baking dish with butter; set aside.

Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium high heat. Add popcorn kernels to hot oil. Cover the pan and cook until popping stops. Shaking the pot occasionally and keeping lid on to prevent burning.

Pour popcorn into prepared baking dish.

Melt butter and stir in marshmallows until melted. Pour marshmallow mixture over popcorn and mix evenly.

Allow to cool enough to handle, butter your hands and shape into 8 equal balls. Press together gently but firmly enough so that they hold their shape. Don't compact them too tight, or they will be too hard to eat once set.


